


DOWNING COLLEGE CAMBRIDGE

Timetable for General Admission

Friday 28 June 2024

From 8am to 10.30am

Vehicle access for on-site parking.

From 9am to 11am

Graduands register with the Tutorial team outside D Staircase. Please come dressed ready for Congregation.

11am

Graduands assemble for group photograph, with talk by the Praelector about Senate-House procedures.

11.45am

Graduands assemble outside the Chapel for Procession to the Senate-House.

12.20pm

Guests advised to leave for Senate-House.

12.30pm

Procession to Senate-House begins.

12.45pm

Guests to arrive at Senate-House.

12.50pm

Graduands to arrive at Senate-House.

1pm

Senate-House ceremony livestream in the Howard Theatre.

1pm

Session begins at Senate-House.

1.35pm

Approximate finishing time of Congregation at Senate-House.

From 2pm

Plated lunch and drinks served from the marquee in front of the Dining Hall. Additional seating is available in the Dining Hall and Fellows' Garden.

From 3.45pm

Group photographs available from the Porters' Lodge.

From 4pm

Vehicles can leave the site.



Dress Code

Please be aware that you MUST adhere to the dress code outlined by the University when attending your graduation.

If you haven't already, please arrange to hire your academical dress (gown, hood, etc.) immediately so you have it for when you come to register in the morning.


You will NOT be permitted to graduate if you do not have the correct academical dress.

The suppliers will be able to advise you on what you require.

Any variation from the University dress code

normally required for graduation, such as national dress or military uniform, must receive permission in advance from the University Proctors. To apply please email your request to: graduation@dow.cam.ac.uk





Dress options

Under your academical dress you MUST be dressed appropriately. The College may be fined if you do not adhere to these rules and you may not be permitted to graduate. There are two dress options:

Dress option one

- A dinner jacket or black, very dark grey or very dark blue lounge suit. These must be dark enough not to contrast obviously with a black gown.
- A plain, long-sleeved, collared, white shirt.
- Formal black shoes. Sandals are not permitted.
- Unpatterned black or very dark grey socks.
- White bow-tie and bands must be worn.

Dress option two

• A black, very dark grey or very dark blue skirt suit or trouser suit, or a dark skirt without a jacket, or a dark, long-sleeved

dress. These must be dark enough not to contrast obviously with a black gown.

- A plain, long-sleeved, white shirt or blouse (unless a long-sleeved dress is worn).
- Formal black shoes. Sandals are not permitted.
- Unpatterned black, nearly-black, or natural coloured hosiery.
- A white bow-tie and bands may be worn (optional) but only with a properly collared white shirt.





A black cassock may be substituted for a dark suit, skirt or dress in either **dress option one** or **dress option two**, but it must be worn with either a white bow-tie and bands or a clerical collar and bands.

It is essential you follow the dress code.

Graduands wearing skirts/dresses:

- Plain black shoes worn only
- NO flashes of colour or white
- NO heels or toes on show (sandals are not permitted)
- You must wear tights (black or natural colour) bare legs are not permitted
- There are no guidelines on skirt/dress length but you must be able to kneel (and get back to your feet) with dignity!

Graduands wearing trousers:

- A matching jacket must be worn when wearing trousers, for both dress option one and dress option two
- Plain BLACK socks are essential and no

motifs or flashes of colour are permitted

Flat shoes

Flat shoes are recommended. While high heels are permitted within the dress code, the walk to Senate-House is over cobbles and uneven paving which can be uncomfortable. You will be on your feet for some time and the floor at Senate-House can be very slippery on a wet day.





Senate-House

There is no dress code for guests watching the ceremony at Senate-House, but most guests wear smart clothing appropriate for a formal occasion such as a wedding.

Please check the weather conditions on the day and dress accordingly. There is no shelter near Senate-House and visitors are advised to bring umbrellas in case of wet weather as there are occasionally delays before guests and/or graduands are allowed entry.

To ensure that your visit to the University is as safe as possible, enhanced security procedures have been implemented.

The University will not allow rucksacks, holdalls, shopping bags or bags larger than 35cm x 25cm into Senate-House or Senate-House yard. If you bring large bags to the

Congregation, you will be asked to make alternative arrangements for their storage or may be denied entry to the event. If you need to keep your bag with you, you must seek assistance from a Proctor/Constable who will check contents prior to entry to Senate-House.

Graduands are not permitted to carry anything into Senate-House with them, please give any bags/umbrellas to your guests to look after during the ceremony.





Guest tickets

Please carry your own ticket for entry to Senate-House, rather than in groups, to make processing as quick as possible.


If you have access requirements at Senate-House, please speak to one of the officials wearing a top hat on arrival.

Photography

Photography or recording of any kind is not permitted during the Senate-House ceremony.

Lunch

arrangements

Lunch tickets for graduands and guests will be given out at registration.

A plated lunch and drinks will be served from the marquee on the lawns in front of the Dining Hall.

There will be seating and shelter available in the marquee, in the Dining Hall and in the Fellows' Garden.

Accessibility and toilets

Level access to the Dining Hall and B/C staircases is via West Lodge Garden.



Accessible toilets are available in B staircase, Howard Theatre basement (via lift) and the Butterfield Cafe.

Additional toilets are located in D, T and U staircases, as well as B staircase (first floor via lift.)

Graduands and their guests must vacate College accommodation before 10am on Saturday 29 June.

Parking

Parking in College will be available from Thursday 27 June until Saturday 29 June. There are time limits on arrival and departure times.
